Introduction

Knowle Local History Society publishes occasional papers on aspects of village history. They are based on over thirty years research, through which we have acquired a vast store of experience and unsurpassed local knowledge.

Publications provide a means of sharing our knowledge with a wider audience in a more permanent form, with any profit used to finance the next publication or the Society's exhibitions. The list is small at present, but will be increased as time permits. CDs and DVDs may be published in the future.

Booklets are in A5 format, ranging in length from twenty four to forty pages, and in price from £2.50 to £4. They are printed in-house in the Society's house style, with an attractive laminated cover, and are illustrated with colour photographs. The Society holds a small stock of each, with extra copies printed as necessary.

The Society also publishes the occasional leaflet, several free mini-guides in 1/3 A4 and three newsletters a year.
