# TALK: KIXLEY LANE

The talk on Kixley Lane was a joint effort, illustrated by photographs both old and new and including a number of snippets of information given by long-standing Knowle residents specially for the occasion. It was enhanced by other little pearls provided by members of the audience, which we shall add to the text - the ghost at *Far End* was new to many of us. Kixley Lane is an ancient lane in the heart of the old village which is mentioned in very early documents. The talk covered the main features of the lane, including Dr. Anthony Upton's theory that before the church was built villagers probably walked to church at Hampton this way.
