### **EXHIBITIONS**

The first exhibition in Knowle this year was *The Westminster Connection* at Knowle Library in April, which outlined Knowle's connections with the Abbey and its legacy today. We have had a continuous presence in the show cases at Solihull Library

since before Christmas, starting with *Images of Knowle*, followed by *Six Knowle Buildings*, which will be taken down in the next few days. The next one at Solihull will be *The Railway Station*, first seen in Knowle in 2008. It will run from August 1st to September 30th. We are pleased to have a further opportunity to put our exhibitions on show, as they are only up for a limited time at Knowle.

The summer exhibition in Knowle will be *The Place Names of Knowle* to follow the May talk. It will include the modern road names, for which there will be no time in the talk. It will be on show for the first time at Knowle Festival in the Park as usual, followed by Barston Fete and then at Knowle Library in November. In early September *Knowle's First Grocer's Shop*, now occupied by Lloyd's Bank, but which many of remember as Band & Meeks, will be our contribution for this year's Heritage Open Days. This shop has been a grocer's since the early 1800s and been associated with three families: the Kimbells, the Courts and Band & Meeks. The Exhibitions Group is already working on it and we are grateful for the help of the families concerned. In addition we shall be providing exhibitions for Knowle British Legion's 90th anniversary celebrations in June and for the Oxfam Bookshop Book Fair in July. See the Diary Box for details.

### **PUBLICATIONS**

Having found a way of producing covers the committee has concluded that in some cases we can print booklets very well on a personal computer, giving us several advantages: no great initial cost or concern about how many we can sell, the facility to produce booklets which do not warrant a commercial print run and the possibility of using more colour. *The Place Names of Knowle* is in the last stages of preparation and we hope it will be available at the talk in May or shortly afterwards. It includes more information than can be accommodated in the talk or the exhibition. Spare copies of the *Growing Up In Knowle* leaflets, which were circulated to members with previous newsletters, are now available presented as a collection under the title of *Memories of Four Seasons*. *The Canal Through Knowle* will follow later, but as there are rights to clear we may produce others first. It is worthwhile restating that the intellectual rights to the *text* remain with the *author*, notwithstanding any copyright statement relating to the Society's *publication rights*. All booklets will be on sale at Knowle Library or direct from the Society and will be well publicised.
