

THE IMAGE LIBRARY & DIGITAL RECORDS

More items have been acquired for exhibitions, including photographs of 1644 High Street from the Curtis family for *The Old Parsonage*. In all the Society holds over 300GB of data, including the image library, project files and much more. Meticulous backing up is crucial: there will be no change from Drag-and-Drop, which works perfectly well, until we are *absolutely certain* that any new system meets our requirements. A new cataloguing system, however, must be given time soon.

PUBLICATIONS

No new publications have been produced this year. Existing ones sell well, particularly before Christmas. *The Canal Through Knowle*, *The Place Names of Knowle* and for the time being *The Great War in Knowle*, are the most popular.

OUTSIDE EVENTS

As usual the Society provided guides at Knowle Parish Church for Heritage Open Days in September; but the normal exhibition was replaced by two guided tours and a leaflet: *Knowle War Walk ~ The Great War*. The Great War exhibition had a further showing on August 8th at the Royal Regiment of Fusiliers (Royal Warwickshire) World War 1 Day.

The Junior School project took a different form this year: a group of members and others were interviewed by Year 6 pupils on the Second World War. For the first time we assisted Year 3 (studying the Home Front) and Year 2 (studying the Victorians). The Society is always pleased to help the school in any way possible. In June the chairman was pleased to attend the launch of the *Our Warwickshire* project by Heritage and Culture Warwickshire. Eight talks to outside organizations have been given during the year, with several bookings already confirmed for 2015/16, including some for a repeat appearance with a different talk. In September the Society will attend Dorridge Day, which falls in the Society's 2015/16 year.

FUTURE PROGRAMME

The first events of 2015/16 will be Heritage Open Days on September 12th (see Diary Box) and *The Old Parsonage* exhibition. The meetings programme will follow a slightly different pattern in 2016: there will be an additional meeting in July in lieu of the Summer Buffet, which will have a social side (light refreshments with wine), followed by a slide show. This will meet members' wishes for both and will fill the gap between April and October. There will be two exhibitions with associated talks, but no exhibition for Heritage Open Days in September 2016: various alternatives are under discussion.

Remaining dates for 2015 and early 2016 are in the Diary Box; the fixture card will be circulated in January, when the final programme for 2016 will be published.

However, plans which have been on the agenda for some time have had to be deferred and which must be given some priority next year. We are a small team, and must be realistic as to how much we can achieve. More about this under Future Programme below.

Once more we thank the library staff at both Knowle and Solihull, Oxfam Books & Music and the many long-standing local residents, who have provided material and/or information, together with all those who have worked hard to make the Society a success: the committee, the working groups, the speakers, and many more; and our members for their support.

FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION

The Society's administration remains in the capable hands of the Secretary and the Treasurer, who have worked well together for several years. Finances are healthy. The Society has purchased more equipment, including an external DVD drive with Roxio software, and has repaid the costs of the projector and some relatively small historic items. This still leaves a reasonable reserve. Membership currently stands at 159 (including three members in Australia) - only slightly down on last year.

Publicity has undergone some change: copy for *Knowle Parish Magazine* is now in a different format, which can be used across various platforms; occasional articles have been submitted to *Our Warwickshire*; images on the television at Knowle Library are now created with different software (significant, but probably not noticeable); the committee discussed using a laptop display at meetings in place of the existing display boards, but came to no conclusion. The Society's mini-guides remain popular.

As the Society expands more people are needed to spread the load, most particularly in the fields of publicity, the web site, digital imaging and maintenance of the image library. The minutes of the last AGM are enclosed; both these and this report will be taken as read; the accounts will be available at the AGM.

MEETINGS & SOCIAL EVENTS

The 2014/15 programme has followed the usual format, with two talks on Knowle with in-house speakers and two with outside speakers. The talk after the AGM was *An Image Library for Knowle*, a tribute to the late Geoffrey Dean. The February talk was once again given by Andrew Bryson, this time on *The Canal Through Knowle*. Outside speakers were Laurence Ince speaking about *Warwickshire and the Holbeche Family* in November and Tim Cogan, to whom we could have listened for hours, on *Evelyn's War*, the story of two young women manning narrow boats on the canal in the Second World War. The Spring Lunch was an enjoyable occasion, but the Summer Buffet was cancelled through lack of support. The committee has it in mind to ring a few changes next year (see Future Programme below).

EXHIBITIONS

Exhibitions at Knowle this year were *An Image Library for Knowle*, followed by *The Canal Through Knowle* in April, both preceded by an associated talk. A short version of the canal exhibition was on show at Oxfam Books & Music in July and can be seen again at Dorridge Day in September.



At Solihull Library the year started with *Two Knowle Shops ~ Maddocks & Sodens*, followed by *The History of Knowle Park*. Thereafter the programme was affected by the refurbishment of the library. *The Place Names of Knowle* has been deferred until its completion.

TALKS & GUIDED WALKS

Considerable time has been devoted to amending existing talks, reducing them to forty-five minutes in length, inserting new photographs and information and a certain amount of restructuring. *A Thousand Years of Knowle* has still topped the popularity list, with *The History of Dorridge* catching up fast; *The Great War in Knowle* has remained in demand. Time constraints have sent plans for short half-hour talks, which some organizations want after a meal, sent to the back burner. They will be created as soon as possible by splitting existing talks. One or more can be combined as required.
